IoW – Fun and fantastic results for MADJA

A 6am start and a ferry trip was required to get us to our final league match of the season at a very sunny Sandown on the Isle of Wight. Despite the long trip, some very impressive performances ensued with Edie Noble breaking the under 13 girls club twice (4.59m) on her way to victory in the long jump. Not to be outdone Oscar Hennessy Leach equalled the under 13 boys long jump record going out to 4.66m. Ben Jones clocked an impressive 5m 04.8s over 1500m to also set a new club record.

In the U15 boys the new ESAA javelin champion Thomas Holmes achieved PBs in both the 100m and 300m as well as throwing a modest 50.81m (for him at least) to win the javelin. Ed George just missed out a PB over 80m hurdles but still done enough to take maximum points. Georgie Noble claimed 1st place in the under 15 girls high jump adding 8cm (1.47m) to her PB in the process.

In the under 17s it was all about which team could place highest to claim the team cup. Going into the day the boys led by a single point from the girls. Wins for Charlie Curry (100m), Dan Davis (1500m) and a big PB (45.15m) from Jay Roden to finish 2nd in the javelin put the boys in a dominant position but A & B string wins in the shot putt for Annie Fitter and Ellie Warren as well as a 2nd place for Maddie George in the 800m saw the girls pull it back. In the end both teams placed 3rd on the day resulting in the boys retaining the team cup by a solitary point.

Ellie Mullins came 3rd in the girl's quad kids to finish the season with a 1st, a 2nd and 2 3rds to sign off on her impressive u11s career in style.

The trip back was meant to include a fish and chip stop in Cowes but nobody informed the owners of the local chippy so most took advantage of the ferry cuisine. The back of the bus sang pretty much all the way home to bring down the curtain on not only a superb day but an amazing season.
